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On September 19-21 the 2018 ACCFO Fall Conference was held at Crowne Plaza Resort in Asheville. Due to Hurricane Florence, a number of coastal community colleges were unable to attend however they indicated they would be attending the 2019 ACCFO Fall Conference at Carolina Beach on October 16-18, 2019. The conference started out remembering all the community colleges that were impacted by Hurricane Florence. Even under the difficult circumstances many community colleges throughout the state that had the effects of the hurricane were able to still attend. We had 32 community colleges in attendance along with 48 exhibitors. Vendors and members both expressed their support of the community colleges impacted.

The professional development sessions and the exhibitors were set up at the Exhibition Center just behind the hotel. The exhibitors were able to introduce themselves and give a brief description of their firm's goals. The first session was done by Smith Sinnett. This was a team building activity dealing with building a structure using straws, string, and tape referred to as the



marshmallow challenge. You can see the marshmallow in the picture of the team building effort. This was followed by Jerry Picker demonstrating tips and tricks to make the most of your Excel spreadsheets. Most facility people utilize many different types of information in spreadsheets and Jerry was able to provide some short cuts in using Excel.

Wednesdays activities finished off with a very

nice dinner at Crowne Plaza restaurant with members and vendors. Everyone had a chance introduce themselves and have a relaxing evening. Thursday morning started with breakfast and a chance to win door prizes supplied by our outstanding group of vendors.





Thursday started out with an adjustment to the schedule which most facility people are use to adapting to these situations. Russell Smyre gave a very positive and inspirational session to help motivate ourselves and people around us. Russell discussed why we tend to do things the way we think they should go based on behavior and beliefs. It was good that many of our vendors participated and they have decided to ask Russell to come and discuss his thoughts with their firm. He fielded a lot of questions after his presentation, one person referred to it as

"Rich Information".

Thursday afternoon began with Zach Harris illustrating how to utilize a land-scaping software program that he designs planting areas around his campus. He showed different areas where he created flower beds using various plants and scrubs. It made you feel like you needed to get back to your campus and start designing. A number of members and vendors thought that the price for the software was within their budget. If you would like more information,

Reid Conway with the State Energy Office illustrated the progress that the community colleges has made in conserving energy since 2007. He compared the total square footage from 2007 to last years square footage. He showed the cost per square footage for that span of years. He indicated that the community colleges are saving their communities thousands of dollars

per day. Reid discussed how new technologies are helping even the smaller facilities save

energy dollars. Blake Bostic explained what he is doing at Stanly Community College to handle their sustainability and energy measures and the impact it is having on their overall utility savings.



RALEIGH – The State Board of Community Colleges today (Sept. 21) approved the selection of Dr. Darrin Hartness as president of Davidson County Community College.

A career educator and administrator, Hartness has spent the past seven years as superintendent of Davie County Schools. He earned his doctoral degree in educational leadership and master's degree in curriculum and instruction and instructional systems technology from the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. He earned his bachelor's degree in industrial arts and secondary education from Appalachian State University.

Hartness will begin work at DCCC in January 2019, succeeding Dr. Mary Rittling, who is retiring in December after 15 years as president.
